For many Christians the world has become a frightening place, ethically there is deep confusion and people are unsure about what is right and true. We now live in a culture where the Christian outlook on life has almost completely disappeared and has been replaced with a range of belief systems that are far removed from the biblical world we know and understand. The two most prominent belief systems that shape our culture are those people who claim no religious belief (secularists) and Islam. Both continue to exert their presence on society at large.

As Christians we have been called to be witnesses for Jesus Christ but because we are not even sure we understand what is happening in our culture we don't know where to start let alone speak into this situation.

This is not dissimilar to the situation that God's people faced as they entered the Promised Land long ago. They were meant to be a light to the nations (Isa. 42:6) yet they were going into a land that was full of rival belief systems so the prospect was just as daunting for them. Moses prepared them for the challenging by teaching them the content of the book we call Deuteronomy.

In this year's Mini Bible School we will briefly look at some highlights of Moses' message from Deuteronomy and learn lessons that will help us navigate our own confusing culture. We will then look at key questions that help us to understand a person's belief system, such as:



- 1. What is God like?
- 2. What are humans like?
 - 3. What is wrong with the world?
- 4. What is the solution?

Answering these questions from a biblical perspective will help us speak into our own confused culture today.

The purpose of the Mini Bible School is to help us to make sense of our culture and enable us to persuasively present Christian truth to people around us in everyday settings.

Our culture is confusing but the gospel shows the way!






